The Exploring the Jewish Experience Course, EJE2023, is more than an introduction to Judaism. It is a sustained, deep reflection on Jewish life, practices, religion, culture, ideas, and history. The EJE course is touches on the most consequential teachings, history, and enduring characteristics of one of the oldest continuous religions and cultures in human history.

EJE2023 is taught by master teacher, Rabbi Dov Gartenberg of <u>Shabbat with Friends New Mexico</u> and other outstanding local teachers. This course, available in-person and online, has two other great features. First, tuition is only \$18 for each semester (There are 3). Second, you can join the course at the beginning of any of the eight different series of classes, each devoted to a distinct topic.

- The EJE is designed for young and old, people with diverse backgrounds, Jewish, non-Jewish, intercultural couples, and anyone fascinated and curious about Judaism.
- The EJE includes study of the rich cultural heritage of Judaism exploring literature, music, the arts, cuisine, politics, and humor along with religious teachings of the Torah, the way of Mitzvot, and the wisdom of Jewish sages, philosophers, and mystics.
- The EJE offers an in-depth inquiry into the ideas of modern Jewish movements, the influence of Zionism, and the phenomenon of Anti-Semitism.
